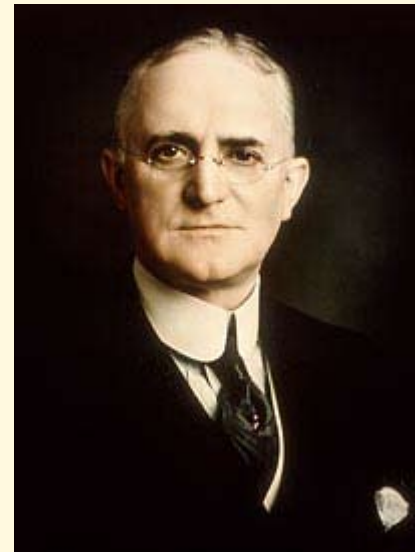

He took his first dry-plate photograph the next year with the camera that he invented — a view of the building across the street from his window. He developed this little handheld camera, and he called it the Kodak because it was easy to remember, difficult to misspell, and it meant nothing, so it could only be associated with his product.

NYSMATA extends condolences to Mr. Seeger, the Seeger family and friends.

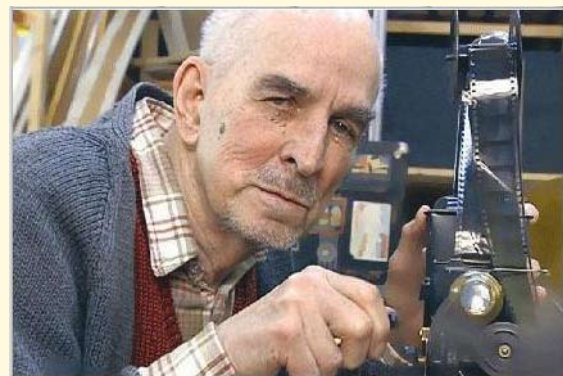

July 14 was the birthday of Swedish director and writer **Ingmar Bergman**, born in Uppsala (1918). He studied theater in college, and made his way into the film business in 1941, rewriting screenplays. Over the next decade, he wrote and directed more than a dozen movies. His first big international success came in 1955, with *Smiles of a Summer Night*, which won the Grand Prix at the Cannes Film Festival. *The Seventh Seal* and *Wild Strawberries* followed in 1957.

Bergman became known for making films about mortality and isolation. In one interview, he admitted that he couldn't watch his films anymore because he found them depressing. He influenced an entire generation of young filmmakers. Woody Allen called Bergman "probably the greatest film artist, all things considered, since the invention of the motion picture camera."

NCCAS Public Review

The public review of drafts of standards Pre K - 8 is now closed.

The left sidebar on the site contains research, resources, the conceptual framework and media arts reference materials. We hope that you can set aside some time to take a look -- come August, you will likely be involved with your September plans. Many of you will find yourselves driving to school to set up and prepare while you dodge the floor waxers and perplexed custodians who are wondering why you find it necessary to be there prior to labor day.

A public review of the comprehensive draft PreK-12 standards, including model cornerstone assessments, will begin in January, 2014. You will really want to be in on this as there is a good chance these standards will be adopted by the states. The timing will not be convenient -- it never is; but this will be your opportunity to have your voice heard.

The current project time line now includes a release date of March, 2014, for the complete and finished standards.

NYSMATA will alert you as soon as we are notified as to the specific date when the public review begins.

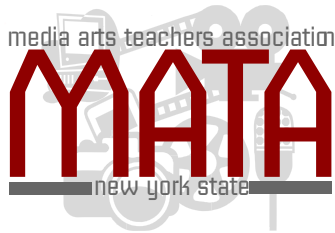
You know their faces and their names as they have co-ordinated your spring media art show for years and you, perhaps, have been a participant.
