NYS Summer School of Media Arts

NEW YORK STATE SUMMER SCHOOL FOR MEDIA ARTS SUMMER 2018 HOSTED AT ALFRED STATE COLLEGE

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The School of Media Arts is a program within the New York State Summer School for the Arts (NYSSSMA) – a four-week intensive that offers high school students concentrated courses in filmmaking, video and photography, electronic sound art and computer animation. The program is hosted by the Department of Digital Media and Animation at SUNY Alfred State College, and the classes are taught by faculty who are working artists in their fields. The curriculum includes hands-on production, exposure to media art history and contemporary practices, and engages with nearby media arts spaces such as Squeaky Wheel in Buffalo and the Visual Studies Workshop and George Eastman House in Rochester.

Throughout the month, NYSSSMA students interact with a range of visiting media-makers, from fine artists to photojournalists. NYSSSMA takes an exploratory approach to art-making, and students combine technical skills with critical thought. Many participants go on to study media arts in college, and recent alumni are attending UCLA and NYU Film Schools as well as SUNY schools with media art departments. NYSSSA Media Arts alumni are often awarded college scholarships based on portfolios of work made at NYSSSMA.

TUITION & ELIGIBILITY

The program is adjudicated and is competitive. NY State high school students apply with a written artist's statement and samples of their work. Applicants are not required to have previous experience with the mediums they apply to at NYSSSMA – for example, students may not have had prior access to 16mm filmmaking materials or animation or sound-mixing software – we select young artists who exhibit imagination and a commitment to learning new skills. Applications and tuition information for 2018 will be available on our website on November 1, 2017. (Tuition, room and board is approximately \$2200 for the 4-week program.) You will also find information about sliding-fee scholarships for low-income families. We accept up to 50 students each summer.

SAMPLE COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

SOUND DESIGN: Students learn the elements of sound design, field recording, audio mixing and electronic sound art. The curriculum exposes students to experimental composition & avant-garde music, radio & podcast production, and soundtrack mixing for film, video and animation.

16MM & SUPER-8 FILMMAKING: Learning the ins and outs of the Bolex camera, light meter, field production techniques, and chemical film processing students produce both experimental and narrative work. The film class also works with found-footage and hand-painted films, and students are exposed to the history of film, contemporary and historical avant-garde practices, and international and independent filmmakers. Most student work is finished in digital.

News from Poughkeepsie-Based Spark Media New Merit-Based Scholarships

The Art Institute of Mill Street Loft + Spark Media Project is partnering with prestigious arts colleges to provide merit scholarships to local students. The Poughkeepsie organization, which provides advanced arts and media education to youth ages 14-19, is announcing two new scholarships which will offer graduates merit-based awards to attend Moore College of Art & Design and Montserrat College of Art.

Art Institute staff will choose deserving high school seniors to receive scholarships to the two colleges. Moore College of Art & Design, a woman's school in Philadelphia, has created a scholarship fund specifically for Art Institute students. The scholarship is designed to honor the role that art teachers play as mentors to aspiring artists. Beginning in the fall of 2018, one student will receive an award, renewable over four years, for a total of \$20,000 towards attending Moore.

In a similar initiative, Massachusetts school Montserrat College of Art, will award up to five Art Institute graduates with scholarships of \$16,000 per academic year, to reach a total of \$64,000 over the course of 4 years of study.

These two new scholarship opportunities, and the unique role of hand-picking students to receive them, are a result of long-standing relationships between the Art Institute and the colleges. According to Todd Poteet, the founding director of the Art Institute, "It has always been the goal of the Art Institute to provide access to higher education for our students, especially those students in financial need. For more than 20 years, 99% of our graduates have received merit-based awards to college. I believe that these new initiatives honor that tradition and the quality of the work of our students."

The Art Institute is not a newcomer to helping students achieve enrollment in college arts programs, and scholarships to support youth in attending the school of their choice. The Art Institute is a pre-college portfolio development program for students interested in a career in the arts, and aims to place every student in college on merit scholarship. Graduates of the Art Institute have been offered more than \$42,000,000 in merit scholarships since 1996. The Art Institute offers a variety of courses, including filmmaking, painting, sculpture, animation, photography, and drawing, where students prepare competitive portfolios to gain college admission and work towards careers in the arts. In addition to helping students cultivate foundational skills in a variety of mediums, the Art Institute offers portfolio development and scholarship preparation courses to help local youth appeal to the nation's top art schools. Students will have the opportunity to impress colleges at Portfolio Day from 4-8pm on November 3rd at the Henry A. Wallace Center. Representatives from over 39 colleges will critique student work, interview potential applicants, and provide information on the programs offered at their schools. College representatives from across the country will be in attendance, including Maryland Institute College of Art, Pratt Institute, The School of the Art Institute of Chicago, Columbus College of Art & Design, Rhode Island School of Design, Montserrat College of Art and Moore College of Art. Portfolio Day is a free event open to teachers, parents, and high school and college students interested in attending a college art program. VISION

This Festival is held in of honor Rod Serling and his work, which has had a lasting influence on the television industry and media creation. The Festival seeks to inspire the next generation of filmmakers.

BIOGRAPHY

Rod Serling (1925-1975) is an American icon. An Emmy-award winning writer and producer, he was best known for his role as creator and host of THE TWILIGHT ZONE. His innovative work, infused with a sense of moral responsibility and artistic integrity, maintains a cult status. A native of Binghamton, NY, Serling spent his final years as a professor at Ithaca College.

HISTORY

The Rod Serling Video Festival launched in 1995 and has welcomed hundreds of entries throughout the years. In 2014, <u>Larry Kassan</u> retired as Festival Founder & Director. WSKG Public Media assumed coordination responsibilities and the project was renamed.

VISIT

The Festival is held in partnership with the Art Mission and Theater, Binghamton City School District's Rod Serling School of Fine Arts, New York State Media Arts Teachers Association and the Serling family.





Duties and Responsibilities:

Members of the **Board of Directors** set policy and promote the association's philosophy and by-laws.

The **Co-Presidents** work collaboratively, maintain contact with the regional directors and are the liaisons with the NYS Office of Special Projects / the Summer School of the Media Arts. The Co-Presidents represent the NYSMATA membership at NYSED meetings and conferences. They also oversee and edit the monthly/ bi-monthly newsletter.

The **Vice President** as an assistant to the Co-Presidents, maintains contact with the Regional Directors and solicits news from the membership for publication in the newsletter. The Vice President may be called upon to represent NYSMATA at meetings and functions when the Co-Presidents are unavailable.

The **term of office** for all positions is four years and officers may serve multiple consecutive terms as elected by the membership or until newly elected officers assume their post. Past officers receive the title "Emeritus" and as such serve as consultants.
