
Shows typically take place in March and April. Let us know as soon as your date and venue are announced and we will publish the shows in the newsletter.

NISKAYUNA HIGH SCHOOL FILMMAKER BREAKS RECORD AT PRESTIGIOUS FILM FESTIVAL FROM ANOTHER DIMENSION.

This past July, Lucas Neufeld from Mr. Stephen Honicki's Advanced Studio in Film program at Niskayuna High School had been notified that THREE of his short films had received accolades in the 2018 Rod Serling Film Festival. The films were screened on Saturday, July 7th, 2018 at The Forum Theatre in Binghamton, NY.

The Rod Serling Video Festival launched in 1995 and has welcomed hundreds of entries throughout the years. In 2014, Larry Kassan retired as Festival Founder & Director. WSKG Public Media assumed coordination responsibilities and the project was renamed.

The Festival is held in of honor Rod Serling and his work, which has had a lasting influence on the television industry and media creation. The Festival seeks to inspire the next generation of filmmakers. Jackie Stapleton-Durham, Education Director at WSKG announced (in introducing Mr. Neufeld) this was the first time in the festival's history that it has had a TRIPLE NOMINEE (AWARD WINNER) in one year.

This is the first year Lucas has received an award in this juried festival for his short films. He follows in the footsteps of Niskayuna High School alumni Evan Pritchard, Calvin O'Connor, Christopher Perrella, and Michael Borowiec to receive this distinction of multiple awards.

The experimental short, "The Gender Thing", was selected to be screened at this year's Capital Region Media Arts Festival, High School Regional Juried Exhibition at Albany Center Gallery, Flick Fest 2018 Film Festival, and the Inland Empire Media Academy.

"The Gender Thing" is an experimental film with a social commentary subtext. In discussing his concept, Neufeld spoke to his inspiration, "I decided to make a film about something that has been in the news rather frequently: being a transgender individual in our society. In reading about new policies our Government has put into place about it, along with story after story upon the internet, I became sick. I saw so many great, inspiring things from transgender people who had come out after years of depression and anxiety, only to find in the



comments, those who detested and called these beautiful people horrible obscenities." The second award winning film by Neufeld is "Vibrating the Drums". In this drama, Neufeld drew upon personal experience to create this black and white narrative drama. In writing about his experience, Neufeld shared this information – "Most people assume I cannot hear them because I am simply not paying attention. It is actually because I have various hearing issues. Since I was one year old, I have been having sets of tubes in my ears due to nearly constant ear infections. My last surgery I had on my ears was two years ago, it was my seventh. From all the surgeries I developed tinnitus. I almost constantly hear a ring in my ears. Somedays I get serious surges of pain, for various reasons from getting just a drop of water in my ear to accidentally hearing music that is too loud."

In bringing his story to the screen, Lucas spoke to his creative process. "I wanted to show the effects of this in a film. I did not want to have the film merely tell the viewer this. I decided to have the film contain no dialogue and consist of visual representations of how it feels to have this disorder. I wanted the film to feel dark and enclosed so I chose for the film to be in black and white. I used strong lights to create shadows and



show details that make the film more interesting to the viewer. "Vibrating the Drums" is my most personal film and illustrates how I feel sometimes daily." "Vibrating the Drums" received the Juror's Award at the 2018 Fulton-Montgomery Community College High School Regional.

In his filmmaker's statement, Neufeld states, "With each of these films, I chose

to think conceptually rather than based on plot. In doing so, I have found that a lack of dialogue and having the film be much more contained makes for much more powerful filmmaking."

In addition to this sort of trilogy of personal stories, I love the genre of horror. Filmmakers such as Dario Argento, John Carpenter and Brian De Palma inspire me daily and I find myself thinking just of stills from their films often. I have made several short horror films (that feature some comedic elements). "Far Fetched" came from just a long conversation I had with a great friend about losing dogs when we were younger.

Neufeld spent his summer as a teaching assistant in the media arts programs at Proctors Theatre's School of the Performing Arts and is now currently starting his freshman year as a film major at Purchase College.

This marks the fourteenth consecutive year that Niskayuna High School filmmakers have received accolades in this prestigious film festival. Previous winners include:
