Guidance for Locally Developed NYS Media Arts Courses

ARTS COURSE APPROVAL PROCESS UPDATE

The 2017 NYS Learning Standards for the Arts offer fresh and exciting opportunities to re-envision arts curricula for the diverse range of 21st century students we teach in our schools today. The Department recognizes that new arts standards call for professional development opportunities for arts teachers, a chance to collaborate with others, and time for curriculum design and piloting. To assist teachers and districts, the Office of Curriculum and Instruction is currently reviewing the application process for approval of locally developed high school arts courses, with the intention of streamlining the process and providing easily accessible guidance for course design. Teachers from across the state in multiple arts disciplines are assisting us in this process.

Therefore, while this review is ongoing, submissions of new applications, and/or for 1-year and 3-year continuing approvals will not be required until further notice. Until such time as the approval process is reestablished, schools and districts are expected to ensure that new locally developed course offerings designed to culminate in diploma credit, are appropriately aligned to the Arts Learning Standards at the Proficient, Accomplished, or Advanced levels.
