

AN INTERVIEW WITH MICHAEL KARELIS

ALUMNUS OF THE NYSSSA SCHOOL OF MEDIA ARTS

What school and year did you attend NYSSSA?

I attended the School of Media Arts' film class in 2003 and 2004. Ghen Zando-Dennis was my instructor and we were at Cazenovia College in Cazenovia, NY both years.

What was your favorite NYSSSA memory?

It must be the epic 80s dance party we had each summer. People went all out with their costumes and danced like there was no tomorrow.

Why did you choose to attend the School of Media Arts?


I wanted the opportunity to work with film and be around a diverse group of creative peers.

How did your experience at NYSSSA contribute to your career?

My experience helped condition my creative muscle. It gave me the confidence to explore ideas that don't fit a mold. Being around so many other creative individuals opened me up to new ideas that broadened my worldview and in turn made me a better team player. I don't think there's been any other experience that's provided this level of creative, emotional, and social growth in my life.

What advice would you offer to NYSSSA students?

Be present, open-minded and ready to challenge yourself on many levels. Prepare to grow in ways that you weren't expecting in an environment that couldn't be more nurturing and supportive. And when it's all over keep in touch, advocate for the program and arts education in general, and pass on the knowledge and skills you've learned.

Each year, increasing numbers of teens participate in the program, and become a part of our community—young artists and writers, filmmakers and photographers, poets and sculptors, video game artists and science fiction writers—along with countless educators who support and encourage the creative process.

Our Mission

The Scholastic Art & Writing Awards are presented by the Alliance for Young Artists & Writers. The Alliance is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization whose mission is to identify students with exceptional artistic and literary talent and present their remarkable work to the world through the Scholastic Art & Writing Awards. The Awards give students opportunities for recognition, exhibition, publication, and scholarships. Students across America submitted nearly 340,000 original works this year in 29 different categories of art and writing.

Analyzing classroom videos with the Opencast Annotation Tool (OAT)

Germany, demonstrates how the Opencast Annotation Tool supports students in improving their professional vision of classroom interactions.

The current media landscape is characterised by the rise of online platforms which curate and present media content to users, either wholly or partially as a result of algorithmic decision-making. These platforms (such as Facebook, Twitter, Google, YouTube...) and their algorithms for media provision



have brought numerous benefits for consumers, media companies and advertisers. But, at the same time, several concerns and harms have emerged as a result (manipulation, misinformation, disinformation, data protection...), positioning again the role of media literacy at the cornerstone.



Duties and Responsibilities:

Members of the **Board of Directors** set policy and promote the association's philosophy and by-laws.

The **Treasurer** collects dues, maintains the NYSMATA state account, keeps the member list up to date and distributes member cards. Additionally, the treasurer keeps the Co-Presidents informed of our financial health and cc's member lists and account balances to all officers.

The **Vice President** as an assistant to the Co-Presidents, maintains contact with the Regional Directors and solicits news from the membership for publication in the newsletter. The Vice President may be called upon to represent NYSMATA at meetings and functions when the Co-Presidents are unavailable.

The **term of office** for all positions is four years and officers may serve multiple consecutive terms as elected by the membership or until newly elected officers assume their post. Past officers receive the title "Emeritus" and as such serve as consultants.
